## **PARISH COUNCIL**

- Thanks are due to our retired Chairman Bob Screen who achieved much in his 10 years on the parish council and village hall committee.
- A volunteer was managing the Pink Poo campaign aimed at reducing the amount of fouling in the village.
- The planters have been maintained by Mr and Mrs Cormick and look splendid. Plants and bulbs have been purchased by the parish council
- Speeding stickers had been purchased for use on wheelie bins
- The speed limit on the A533 between Shutley Lane and Hole House Lane is to be lowered.
- Several social events have been held including carols around the tree, the May Queen event, the family bingo event, a champagne quiz, the village show and dog show. This year's show would be held on 10 September.
- Litter picks and a Clean for the Queen had been arranged
- The Parish Council has commented on the planning applications received by CWAC.
